Apologia Anatomy Science Class

- Best for kids ages K 8th grades.
- ❖ Parents MUST stay and help with their children.
- Christian Science Curriculum students MUST purchase their own journal from christianbooks.com but parents do not need to purchase the textbook.
- ❖ We will meet at Lavretta Park on Mondays from 10-12, starting August 7.
- \$25 per student will help cover supplies

Apologia exploring creation with human anatomy and physiology science class on Mondays from 10 to 12 at Lavretta Park for the 2023–24 school year. We will meet under the pavilion on typical days and at my home (five minutes away) if the weather is extreme.


Cost: I was able to get the books on sale 20% off from Christianbooks.com and paid just under \$40 for the textbook and just under \$30 each for the journals. If you decide to participate, you would only need to purchase the journal for your child. For supplies, I'm thinking around \$25 per child for the entire year would be sufficient. If it's not, I will just cover the rest. There are a lot of projects and activities with each lesson.

Class time & dates: Since we will typically be meeting at the park, I tried to avoid the park on public school off days. See the picture with the list of dates we will meet for class. After looking at the curriculum, we are going to need a little bit longer than an hour and a half so we will meet from 10-12. We can work for 45 minutes and then have a playground break and then come back and work a little more. My plan is to pack a lunch and have lunch at the park and let the kids play after class. But, families can do whatever works best for them.

Homework: We will do everything in class as far as projects go. However, I might assign some homework for your child if we did not have time during class time. I will communicate about missed work, etc. on our private FB group. The answers to their homework are in the back of the journal. You can tear those out if you think your child will cheat. Or, you can use them for reference. I will not be requiring that homework is completed. It will be up to each individual family, and I will not be giving out grades. Again, this will be determined by each family. Sensitive anatomy topics: Also, because this is anatomy, it does address parts of the body but it does not cover private parts. I know everyone has different opinions on this subject but I like how the curriculum addresses this because it leaves this material up for the parent to address as they see fit. The most detailed part about private parts, in my opinion, is puberty, and you can see pictures of the textbook on our FB page for how they addressed puberty. This is a very conservative curriculum and it leaves these matters for each family to address the way they feel most comfortable. We will not be covering private parts in this class, even though that is part of human anatomy.

Christian curriculum: Also, if you are not familiar with the apologia science series, this is a Christian-based science curriculum. It will have biblical scripture included, and it will reference Jesus and God as the Creator. Again, I know this is not something everyone agrees upon. However, this class will not be a place for debate. If you are not comfortable with a Christian-based science curriculum, this is probably not the program for your family.

The Mobile Belles Leadership Program seeks individuals who:


- Are currently in 8th, 9th, 10th, or 11th grade





Students may take as early college, which does not count as high school credit, or they may take as dual credit for both college and high school.

Do Start South courses transfer to other universities?

For the most part yes, but always check with the other institution.

Do I need an ACT/SAT score to apply?

No. A score on file with USA Admissions is needed if a specific math or science course requires one. Placement for English can be made through the ACT/SAT score or with the high school transcript.

Will Start South affect my eligibility for freshman scholarship?

No, it will not. Start south students are considered First Time Freshmen unless they take a certain number of hours elsewhere before starting university.

What is the Start South Success course?

The Success course grounds new Start South students in online learning and helps them set up their student accounts and learn how to use them.

How much is Start South tuition?

Early College Programs

Dual enrollment allows eligible homeschool students to earn credit toward a college certificate or degree program while satisfying homeschool diploma requirements. Students can complete colleges courses at one of Bishop State's campuses or online.

Dual Enrollment Admissions General Requirements

- Students must be in grade 10, 11, or 12.
- Students must have a minimum unweighted GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale for academic courses and a 2.0 unweighted GPA for career technical courses.
- Students must meet established college placement criteria and/or other course prerequisites prior to enrolling in dual credit courses.

Dual Enrollment Admissions Process

<u>Step 1:</u> To complete an application for admission, visit the following: https://www.bishop.edu/new-students/apply-now. Select *Dual Enrolled High School Student* as your student type. Select the academic term you wish to begin taking courses.

<u>Step 2</u>: Complete an individual eligibility form with your authorized homeschool representative and indicate the courses your student wishes to take for the term. Submit the completed form and a current transcript showing grade level as well as unweighted GPA to <u>earlycollege@bishop.edu</u>.

<u>Step 3:</u> Provide ACT scores or take the Accuplacer on campus to register for English and/or math courses.

<u>Step 4</u>: The Office of Early College Programs will reach out to confirm approval, course selections, and register your student for the desired term.
